Welcome to the Canadian Embroiderers' Guild, London. In this, our 39th year, the Guild hopes that it will again provide a setting for all members to stitch, share ideas, enjoy the companionship of people with common interests and to be the very best embroiderers and fabric artists we can be.

General Information

The Guild meets September through April at St. James Westminster Anglican Church, 115 Askin St.

Two groups comprise the Guild. You may join either group or both.

The **Day Group** meets most Thursdays, with the majority of classes being held on the second and fourth Thursdays. Full-day classes and special events are held on first Thursdays. Class days on second and fourth Thursdays begin with announcements at 9:30 a.m., followed by classes until 12:00 p.m. and lunch from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. An afternoon program which follows may consist of a speaker, a demonstration, a sale or a Guild meeting. The Guild day usually ends around 2:30 p.m.

The **Evening Group** meets at the church on the second and fourth Tuesday evenings of the month. The library is open at 7:00 p.m., announcements are made at 7:15 and classes run from 7:20 to 9:30.

In addition, for both **Day and Evening Groups**, there are two informal stitching sessions held each month, one in the evening at 7:00 p.m. on the first Tuesday of each month, one in the morning at 9:30 a.m., on the Third Thursday. First Tuesday and Third Thursday are held in the Board Room and are open to all Guild members.

The Guild also offers an **Associate Membership**, for those unable to attend regular meetings and classes. An **Associate Member** may attend afternoon programs and take Guild sponsored workshops. All Guild memberships include the use of the Guild library, the Guild newsletter, CEGments, access to the members' only pages of the website and eligibility to attend all special events.

The Guild also sponsors special workshops which are held throughout the year and offered to members at cost.

The Guild holds a number of social events during the year including two retreats, Winter Weekend and Summer Kamp, providing additional opportunities for stitching and companionship.
