Based on independent research into creativity, facilitation skills, sensitivity and intuition, her workshop challenges and encourages participants to discover their unique potential.

**Free Form Patternmaking with Lyn Carter**  
**November 6, 2010**

Participants will learn a step-by-step process for creating three-dimensional forms out of cloth. Lyn will begin the workshop with a one-hour slide presentation followed by a short break. She will then give an introduction to free form patternmaking with paper and demonstrate stiffening cloth with tailoring materials. The final pieces will be machine sewn.

Lyn Carter is a visual artist with a strong textile background. She teaches 3-D Structures in Fibre at the Ontario College of Art and Design University in Toronto.
